Summary Abby Williams Hill (1861-1943) was a landscape painter who worked

Historical Note

Abby Williams Hill (1861-1943) was a landscape painter who worked primarily in the American West. She is known for her commissioned works for the Great Northern and Northern Pacific railroads, which were exhibited at the St. Louis World's Fair in 1904, the Lewis and Clark Exposition in Portland in 1905, the Jamestown Centennial in 1907, and the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition in 1909.

Abby Rhoda Williams was born in 1861, in Grinnell, Iowa. She studied painting at the Chicago Art Institute and with William Merritt Chase at the Art Students League in New York. In 1888 she married

Frank Hill, a homeopathic doctor. The couple moved to Tacoma, Washington, in 1889. Soon after, Hill gave birth to a son, Romayne, her only biological child. The Hill's would later adopt three daughters, Iona, Ina, and Eulalie.

In 1894 Hill spent weekends and summers on nearby Vashon Island. The following year she joined expeditions to Mt. Rainier and Hood Canal. These trips contributed to her interest in hiking, camping, and working en plein air, and led to a brief career as a professional landscape painter for the Great Northern and Northern Pacific railroads.

In addition to her work as a painter, Hill was active in the Congress of Mothers, currently known as the Parent Teacher Association (PTA). She was a founder and the first president of the Washington state chapter and advocated for services for recent immigrants and disadvantaged families.

Later in life, Hill was concerned with the threat that commercial and tourist interests posed to the natural environment. She noted that several of the landscapes that she had painted earlier in her career no longer existed in the state in which she had observed them. In response she embarked on a series of paintings of the western National Parks, which she considered her legacy to future generations.

Abby Williams Hill died in 1943 in Laguna Beach, California.

Content Description

The Abby Williams Hill Collection contains approximately 150 paintings and drawings and includes letters, diaries, daybooks, postcards, news clippings, ephemera, and artifacts documenting the life of Hill and her family. The Hill Collection documents her travels across the nation and in Europe, her relationship with her husband and four children, her experiences hiking and painting in the Pacific Northwest wilderness, and her passion for social causes including her work with the Congress of Mothers. Other topics covered by the collection include Tacoma and Washington State history, the Great Northern and Northern Pacific Railways, the westward movement, various world's fairs, Native American tribes in Montana and Washington, the National Park system, tuberculosis, early childhood education, and African American rights.

Detailed Description of the Collection

I: Correspondence, 1861-1945

The Correspondence Series contains material related to members of the Hill family. The series has been arranged alphabetically by author, then by recipient, then chronologically within each folder. The bulk of the correspondence is to and from Abby Williams Hill, but other Hill family members are also prominently represented, including Frank Hill, Romayne Hill, Ione Hill, Eulalie Hill, and Ina Hill. Of note in this series, in addition to the Hill family letters, there are letters written by Abby Hill to Horace Albright at the U.S. Department of the Interior regarding the deteriorating condition of our national parks and two folders of letters written by Abby Hill to various correspondents detailing her idea to create federal sanitariums in Arizona for tuberculosis patients. Also, Box 23, which is included in this series, contains postcards that have been inscribed by the Hill family and their friends. Two boxes of collected postcards that were never written on appear in the Ephemera Series.

II: Journals, Sketchbooks, and Notes, 1877-1930

The Journals, Sketchbooks, and Notes Series contains books belonging to the Hill family, as well as notes and sketches kept by Abby Hill and her children. The series is arranged by format, alphabetically by author and then chronologically. Journals belonging to Abby Hill date from 1884 when she was teaching at Berthier-en-Haut, a girl's seminary in Quebec, to 1908, when she was abroad in Europe with her four children. The journals detail the daily life and travels of Hill and her children and along with the Hill family correspondence provide insight into Abby Hill's thoughts and activities. There are also several medical journals belonging to Frank Hill from his post graduate studies in Germany and several journals belonging to the children, mostly containing schoolwork. The notes contained in this series are generally fragments and are difficult to piece together.
